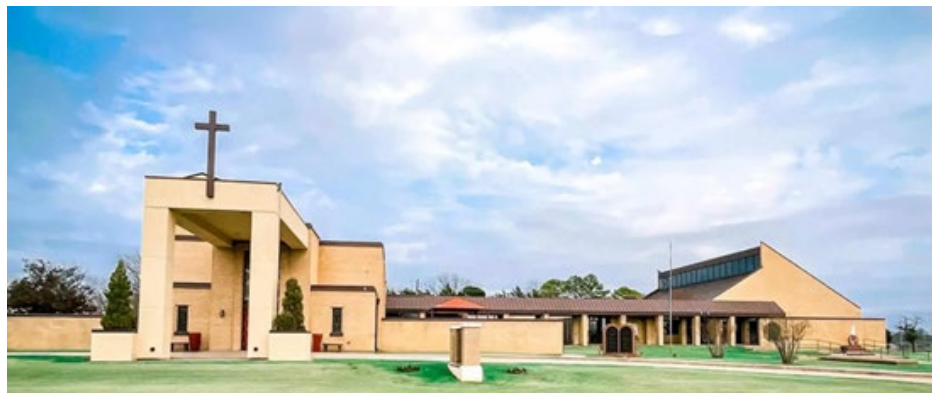

The three things we need to do on Thanksgiving Day are to pray, to attend thanksgiving Mass and to live in gratitude with members of our families and those in need.

Jesus is opening our eyes to realize the ingratitude of the humankind through the Scripture passage picturing Him healing ten lepers. Even though He healed all ten lepers, only one of them returned to thank Him, and he was the Samaritan, a Gentile! How ungrateful were the other lepers ...; Jesus cried out, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?"

This is a beautiful holiday for us Christians to express our appreciation and thanksgiving to God for constantly healing us from the leprosy of sin through the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

In the Gospel Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one returns to give Him thanks. Jesus says to the grateful leper, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Lord Jesus, may we never fail to recognize your love and mercy toward us. Fill our heart with gratitude and thanksgiving, and free us from pride and lack of appreciation.

Help us to count our blessings with gratefulness and to give You thanks in all situations. Amen.
